



Van park's Great Wall of Fibro

WHAT THE DEVELOPERS HID FROM YOU: Here is a small fraction of the 180metre wall of overdevelopment planned along the scenic foreshore-protection zone at Woronora River, as visible to local residents. A total of 50 such cheap two-storey fibro dwellings are to replace one-storey caravans, with population to grow to four times or more on many. Maximum legal population for the local caravan park is 804 residents. [Unofficial montage.]

The existing office block is just visible (background, centre), but would be replaced by more two-storey structures, pretending to be caravans. The de-mountables are promoted as just like Woronora's nearby brick homes with normal yards. This frontage to Menai Road and Prices Circuit would have about 17 such cabins visible in a full-width photo. Boarding houses are the latest fashion among developers. The scheme awaits Council approval.
